

Brief History of the Young Adult Fellowship

The Young Adult Fellowship was established in 1985, following the separation of the youths from the young adults by the Liberia Annual Conference in 1984. The separation was effected at the $51^{\rm st}$ Session of the Liberia Annual Conference held in Yekepa, Nimba County from February 6 – 12, 1884.

Bishop Arthur F. Kulah appointed Rev. Anthony O. Dioh to chair the separation. The meeting for the formal organization of the Young Adult Fellowship was convened at the S. T. Nagbe Retreat Center in White Plains at which time the draft constitution of the fellowship was presented by a committee chaired by Zacharia Major, thus giving birth to the Conference United Methodist Young Ault Fellowship (CUMYAF).

Subsequently, the first National President of the CUMYAF was Bro. Tarley Nyema of Cape Palmas District while others were elected presidents of various districts existing at the time such as Monrovia, St. Paul, Gompa, Gbarnga, Cape Palmas, Sinoe, Grand Gedeh, and Grand Bassa. The YAF was established and is maintained perpetually for Young





Purpose, Colors, and Emblem

The purpose of the Fellowship is to proclaim the Gospel of Christ through **WITNESSING**, **WORSHIPING**, **STUDYING**, **FELLOWSHIP**, **AND SERVING MANKIND AND THE CHURCH**. The YAF emblem contains a circle that is symbolic of the UMC's connectional nature. The pointed star depicts the five fruits of the spirit, The radian (ray) reflection (star) seen by the wise men at Christ's birth, and the fire cross signifies the presence and burning of the Holy Spirit in us. The approved colors of the YAF are, **GOLD** which stands for the period of transition to maturity; White which stands for purity, love and peace; Blue which stands for smartness or alertness; and **RED** which stands for the blood of Christ.






In brevity, I peacefully greet you all in the supreme name of God Almighty, His Son, Jesus Christ, and the Supernatural Power of the Holy Spirit as we all convene here in observance of our 37th Annual Assembly and 38th Anniversary Celebration of ours.

Thus, I refer you to some of my greetings sent to the districts within our conference for your considered reading time at the beginning of State of the Fellowship Address therein.

Conference rules

- 1. All delegates are expected to attend all sessions and participate in all planned activities as part of the conference, except upon the approval of the presiding officer of the session. Any absenteeism without excuse shall warrant said person a penalty to be decided by the presiding officer, not more than L\$100.00.
- 2. Tags must be worn at all times during the various sessions. Any delegate caught in session without his/her tag will face penalties ranging from denial to speak on issues to a fine, not in excess of L\$50.00. Missing tag(s) can be replaced by purchasing tag (s0 from the finance table for L\$75.00
- 3. There shall be no disturbances, loitering, or eating during various sessions of the assembly, except deemed permissible by the presiding officer prior to such action. Anyone caught disturbing, loitering, or eating as indicated will be penalized by the presiding officer.
- 4. All delegates are to be in attendance timely. Latecomers will be fined not less than L\$25.00.
- 5. As prescribed by Article 3 Section 3.5, each decision maker (delegate) is to hold a valid membership card.
- 6. Habitual violation of any rule of the conference by anyone will warrant the individual serious penalty that will be determined by the presiding officer or the body and it shall include expulsion.
- 7. Females are not allowed to wear trousers, while males are not to wear sleeveless shirts, except on Saturday. Generally, all delegates and observers are to dress modestly and decently.
- 8. Parliamentary Procedures and generally accepted Christian principles/practices stand in addition to the supra mentioned.

The 36th Annual Assembly and 37th Anniversary Celebration of the Conference United Methodist Young Adult Fellowship under the theme, "When God Is Involved" with text drawn from God's World According to Genesis 39:1-16 convened with the Grand Bassa District Young Adult Fellowship at the First United Methodist Church in Lower Buchannan City, Grand Bassa County, the Republic of Liberia on Wednesday, January 18, 2022, at 4:35 p.m and ended at 3:30 pm on Sunday, January 23, 2022. The paramount issues, including decisions reached during this annual gathering, are arranged in order of days below:

Thursday: Day 1, January 20, 2022

CALL TO ORDER

The 1st Session of the 36th Annual Session and 37th Anniversary Celebration of the Conference United Methodist Young Adult Fellowship was called to order by the 18th National President, Sis. Mai J. G. Paelay at 4: 35pm on Thursday, January 20, 2022.

Standing in memory of departed Saints

In honor of departed saints, a moment of silence was simultaneously observed by all Yong Adults present at the time.

Welcome Remarks

The Welcome remarks were made twofold: a. on behalf of the Host District, Sis. Gilter Nathan the Host District President welcomed the conference to her district stating that she and her people are glad to be part of the history-making.

b. on behalf of Conference United Methodist Yong Adult Fellowship, Bro. J. Rudy S. Franciah, National General Secretary welcomed members of the conference to the 36th Annual Session and 37th Anniversary celebration of our beloved fellowship.

Acknowledgment of Greetings

Upon the request of the presiding Officer, the Acknowledgement of greetings was done by the General Secretary, Bro. J. Rudy Franciah.

Organization of the Assembly

There's no reason to disbelieve that "It Shall Come to Pass" which is your theme with text taken from the Prophetic Book of Isaiah 10:20-27 because the Holy God of our ancestors is Almighty, powerful, and every problem solver. Let's still be committed to the struggle always. Between you and I, we know that the struggle is for the Lord because the promised leadership has begun.

I would like to draw your attention to the promised leadership which makes Isaiah one of the most well-known prophets when he predicted the coming of the Messiah who redeemed us from sins as He shows us the way to eternity by making emphasis on your theme, "It Shall Come to Pass".

Dear Brethren in St. Paul - 2022:

It is always a useful thing and a fulfilment of Jesus' commandment to greet everyone with prescribed words, [Peace Be Unto You] which is professing God's Peace on them every meeting or encounter. The words, "Peace Be Unto You" were first used by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ to teach his disciples so that they can commit to memory those words and use them always, especially when the harvests are becoming plentiful with scarce laborers. Thus, greet them with peace as dictated by Jesus, love each other unconditionally, reach out to everyone, understand their issues, put your ego lower than theirs, do good, do no



harm and stay in love with God as you pray daily for your Fellowship and the Conference United Methodist Young Adult Fellowship.

Therefore, it is imperative that we unite always no matter what are the situations or differences we have and how impossible from our human perspective seems to be with one loving body, mind, and spirit.


Fussing together completely in all respects from a spiritual eye made the dried bones reunited and lived again as recorded in your text.



Constitution Revision/Amendment Propositions

We, being cognizant of the established legal framework, especially knowing well from the objective point of views as approved by our last Assembly, Articles 3.2.3.4 entitled, Membership and Affiliated Membership, 4.1 (B)(C). 2; 5.2.1, .3, 5.2.4 entitled, The President, General Secretary, Second Vice President, 5.3.0 entitled, Qualification of Elected Executives and Additional Article named and styled, XI: (a -e) Committee on Grievance and Ethics, are proposed for revision and inclusion for this August Body to

adopt at the seat of this 37th Annual Assembly and 38th Anniversary Celebration. Details are reported in the Committee's report.

We endowed with the sincerest blessings of this noble power emanating from this August Body as approved from the 36th Annual Assembly, and exercised through yur National President, Bro. Emmanuel Kpon Saye during his inaugural address in Ganta, on March 20, 2022, created an enormous opportunity for this submission to revise the Constitution and By-Laws of CUMYAF.



The Constitution Review Committee (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") was established by the President of the 19th leadership on the 20th of March 2022 as an adhoc committee to review the 2012 Revised Constitution and By-Laws of the Conference United Methodist Young Adult Fellowship (CUMYAF).

One of the declared reasons for setting up the committee is to thoroughly read each article within the constitution making show that the constitution and by-laws are in connections with the fellowship goals and are applicable to the fellowship present realities.

The mandate of the Committee as set out by the President was to scrutinize the 2012 Revised Constitution & By- Laws in line with developments and changes which have taken place during the past and, in process, also to make appropriate recommendations that suit said developments and changes so as to further secure the achievements of the goals and fulfillment of the aspirations of CUMYAF as enshrined in the Revised Constitution and By-Laws." The Committee was required to review the constitution and submit a report petitioning the EXCO to induce the process.

It is undebatable based on the pieces of facts presented herein to solidify that our [CMYAF] current Revised Constitution and By-Laws contains several provisions are obsolete, non-conforming to contemporary realities, and that other provisions canceled,



and or eliminated are still present in our organic doctrine. Those situations are so egregious and present to anyone reading our Constitution the need to take action not in the future but now.

In additive, this submission is made in respect to Articles 7.0 [b] and 10. [0, & 1] Now, therefore, in keeping with **Article 5.2.1**Titled President: the president shall Appoint committees ------ shall serve as ex-officio on all committee. Against this backdrop, the we constituted the Constitution Review Committee. This committee have worked tirelessly to submit the propositions that have been in circulation across the conference for months for adoption.

Brethren, it is never a secret that most of the issues that have affected this fellowship have had in root in the way our constitution and By-Laws are structured. Therefore, we called on every to support this worthy cause just now.

Planning Retreat

On March 19, 2022 at the Borpoanyee UMC in Ganta, the Fellowship discussed and adopted an annual program activities focusing on CUMYAF First, Gender Equality and Equal Representation with a cost of USD 141, 850. Objective: To reunite CUMYAF post-election through fellowship and play and to strengthen working relation between the incoming leadership and former presidents.


3. Induction ceremony

Young Women Network (YOWONET)



The Conference United Methodist Young Women Network is an integral part of Team Liberia that we cherish so much for helping us to achieve our pillar of gender equality adopted in our strategic plan of action "Team Liberia" Was formed in 2021, by the coming together of United Methodist Women and the Young Women Network of the Liberia Annual Conference with the support of Global United Methodist Women and the supervision of Regional Missionary - Finda Quawa. Team Liberia works closely together in turning faith, hope and love into action for women children and youth. Together, the team provides economic empowerment for women and girls through livelihood skills training, scholarship, mentorship, devotional guide development, participation at assemblies, etc. The team main mission is to nurture the young women into the United Methodist Women Organization so that they are prepared to continue the legacy when the women shall have parted the scene.

Our young women are befitting from the women scholarship at the United Methodist University.



All of the 20 districts and one circuit, with the exception of Guinea districts who young women we were unable to reach benefited from the economic empowerment program of the team. More than 100 young women were trained with livelihood skills (tie and Dye, arts and bags, liquid soap and bleach production). One young woman who is practicing Skills they have learned from the past young women gatherings was selected from each district as direct beneficiary for the Economic empowerment project. Some of the beneficiaries received their materials for their small business and others will receive their materials during this 37th Annual Assembly of CUMYAF.

Our Representative, Martha B. Dobboh informed us that there's currently a small Agro Business Project that will begin in this month (January 2023) within the three regions; three districts. (Nana Kru from Region 3, Moweh from Region 1 and Lofa River District



from Region 2). The project is a pilot project. The result will give us another opportunity to get a bigger project which will cover the rest of the districts.

The team also attended a one-week intensive training for transformation (TFT). 10 young women from the three regions benefited from the training. The 10 Young Women are to train not less than 80 young women before the end of this conference year. The team was at the just ended young women gathering where they trained the young women. They provided some training to the young women on the Book of Discipline, the YAF constitution and some livelihood skills training.

Team members are (Committed servant leader, Sis. Martha Blogwedy Dobboh, my immediate predecessor, Sis. Mai J. G. Paeley, Sis. Felecia J.W. Dorbor, and Sis. Hawa P. Guwor). We want to appreciate all but Sis. Martha and Hawa take the credit for the periodic updates they give us relative to this project for our young women.

On Thursday, October 13, 2022, a cross-sectional of our young women gathered with the People's Gompa District Young Women Network at the Grace United Methodist Church in Ganta to observe the Young Women Network (YOWONET) Annual Symposium. The YOWONET Symposium was attended by 14 districts out of the 21 districts. A few of the major activities during the program included reviewing of each district YOWONET activities through listening and discussing district coordinators' reports, Workshop (History and importance of Young Women Gathering & The importance of the constitution/ book of discipline and their usage), livelihood skills training, parade, sports, trauma healing session, talent night and closing service.

Under the theme, "Do Not Empty Yourself" with text from 2 King 4:1-7, celebrated peacefully in love, kindness, fellowship, studying of the words and reconnecting the wheel of sisterhood as the was climaxed on October 15, 2022. Sis. Gitler Nathan and her team ensured that the YOWONET Annual Symposium became a success. We want to appreciate them too.

Membership

It is with an appreciable heart that we recognize the efforts of the membership committee, chair Bro. Prince Dweh and his team for developing a form to capture members of our conference but regretfully, district presidents have not fully cooperated on that. Howbeit, it is our understanding is that the district president's reports at the Assembly will give us a sense of how much members we have precisely but with a reliance on past district reports that we had a total of approximately 10,000 young adults within the Liberia Annual Conference.

Visitation



During the conference year, we visited several districts sharing thoughts of unity, fellowship, the Biblical principles of love and service, and conducting pieces of training in leadership and development. Those visits were made possible not only through direct presidential visits but with the collective help and support of my able lieutenants, Sis. Martha B. Dobboh, 1st Vice President, Bro. Charles Wilson, 2nd Vice President, Bro. Edwin Dormie, Jr. Chief of Secretariat/Secretary General, Sis. Rebecca Martor, Assistant Secretary General, Sis. Felecia J. W. Dorbor, Treasurer and Bro. J. Rudy S. Francia, Special Assistant. Those fellows, though put in



varying efforts and invested so much such that their efforts cannot go unnoticed. Thus, my thanks and appreciation of gratitude go to each of them.

Therefore, CUMYAF visited the Kru Coast district YAF during her induction program in



April 2022, where we discussed issues relating to the growth of the fellowship such as working together for the purpose, offering our complete participation and services to fellowship at the local, District and national levels. Amongst other issues put before us during the visit by the Kru Coast District Young Adult Fellowship attending the gathering was the unwillingness of the young people to attend the gathering. In response, they were encouraged to find new ways of solving the problem such as periodic but regular visitation to backsliding members and sometimes making gatherings contemporary such as rotation and using different communication media.

Our team visited Nana Kru twice with the first visit in August 2023 where Our 2nd Vice President, Charles Wilson served as Chair of their election Commissions ensuring peaceful, fair, and transparent elections that brought Bro. Austine K.

Kumeh, president and crops of officers to leadership through the spoken wills of the people.


The second visit was at the seat of their Annual Assembly where we conducted a training workshop on the parliamentary procedure, stressing the paramount need to follow the protocols of attending, and organizing meetings, methods of bringing issues on the floor, the systematic methods of disposing of issues, presiding and handling the gavel in a fair and just manner to have everyone heard in all meetings.

In Garraway District, we participated in its Annual Assembly held in November 2022 and conducted a leadership training workshop, focusing on the parliamentary procedure just as we did with the Nana Kru District Young Adult Fellowship. We climaxed the lecture series by admonishing the Garraway Young People to separate the youth from the young adult fellowship. It is our hope that at this 37th Annual Assembly and 38th Anniversary Events of Conference United Methodist Young Adult Fellowship, the Garraway's president will inform us about how far they have gone with this separation.

Thereafter, in Cape Palmas District, we attended all planned activities of the Cape Palmas District YAF, conducting regular leadership training workshops on the roles of elected and appointed officers. Afterward going to the Gee River District Conference in December 2022 where had a very fruitful discussion with the young people concerning the growth of the fellowship. We also recommended to the district leadership, to extend the young people's Annual Assembly time to November, because they are always celebrating in August which is too early.

By the efforts of our 2nd Vice president, Bro. Charles Wilson whom all the visits above are credited, all of the districts in the Southeast participated in the young women training held in the Gee River district.

Additionally, we visited Monrovia, St. Paul, Gompa, Weala, Gbarnga, Kakata Farmington River and Jorquelleh, Districts carrying massages of unity, love, fellowship and conducting similar training discussed above with some districts. The team members who are I hold in my heart deep appreciation and thanks of gratitude are Bro. Edwin Dormie,





Jr., Martha B. Dobboh who led those. At the Lofa River District Women Conference, we engaged the young people, especially the young women who attended the conference by providing education and self-esteem enlightenment to them. Our 1st Vice President, Sis. Martha B. Dobboh is credited for her leadership role played by representing us therein. We conducted another leadership training during the Weala District Young Adult Fellowship Annual Assembly. It was led by our 1st Vice President, Sis. Martha B. Dobboh.

Furthermore, during the day marking the official opening of the Weala District YAF 7th Annual Assembly and 37th-anniversary celebration we were honored to be the opening preacher making use of the conference Theme: The Right Words can Heal a Broken Heart, with text drawn from James 3:7-9. Our Chief of Secretariat, Bro. Edwin Dormie, Jr. who said thus says the Lord, admonished the Weala Young People that words are powerful so they should be used cautiously, stating that it's a Biblical mandate for young people to use their tongues wisely and say kind words to one another as life and death lie in the power of the tongue. He concluded that sitting on the scene and condemning does not help anything because speaking positively and encouraging our neighbors help build the body of Christ - a community where find ourselves and wherein the Lord demands us to love our neighbor as ourselves As a CUMYAF to representative, He additionally facilitated a training session on topics such as The Parliamentary Responsibility in the UMC/YAF, and Robert's rules of order.

Revised Joint Scholarship Concept, June 4, 2022 1.0 Background

The conference United Methodist Youth and Young Adult Fellowships (CUMYYAF) have been in existence for over a period of thirty-eight Years (38) years now, from1984 to the present. These groups have noticed a high rate of illiteracy in the country and conferences, most of all a very high percentage of its population are young people, and they are in the majority uneducated persons in the country (conference), which is a major contributing factor to the downward trend and slow or no improvement in conferences in particular and the Republic of Liberia and the Republic of Guinea in general.



The census conducted by the Liberia Institute of Statistics and Geo-information Services (LIGIS) Liberia had a total population of 3.5 million people in 2008, but as of 2022, the world population matter puts Liberia's population at 5.2 million, and sixty percent of that number are young people. In relation to this, to help to mitigate these issues, the CUMYYAF joint efforts gave birth to the Rev. Dr. Julius Sarwolo Nelson, Jr. Scholarship and Financial Aid Program in 2019. This scholarship foundation which intends to educate young people in the Liberia Area of our church is in honor of the long-serving counseling elder, Rev. Dr. Julius Sarwolo Nelson, Jr. It primarily resulted from a committed joint effort of the Conference United Methodist Youth and Young Adult Fellowships under the stewardship of Bro. Victor K. Howard and Bro. Cyrus Yini presidents' emeritus of the conference United Methodist Youth and Young Adult fellowships.

Although it was launched in 2019 but couldn't take immediate effect because of the COVID-19 and internal fellowships' issues which impeded its progress until 2022. However, it is widely viewed as an answer to the Great Commission of Jesus Christ "And Jesus came and spoke onto them saying all power is given unto me in heaven and in Earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the father, and of the Son and of the holy spirit: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: I am with you always even to the end of the world". (Matthew 28:18-20). Additionally, the 2016 Book of Discipline paragraph 164. E clearly states that we, the United Methodists, believe that every person has the right to education which is the responsibility of education of the young people rests with the family, faith communities, and the government. The provision also stresses that in a society, this function can best be fulfilled through policies that ensure access for all persons to free education and that colleges and universities are to ensure that academic freedom is protected for all members of the academic community and a learning environment is fostered that allows for a free exchange of ideas.

In fulfillment of this great commission (paragraph 127, the ministry of the Laity) and in accordance with the United Methodist Book of Discipline (BoD) as specified, motivated the Reverend Doctor Julius Sarwolo Nelson, Jr. accepted to be the key donor of the joint the Conference United Methodist Youth and Young Adult Fellowships Scholarship program which is named in his honor.

2.0 Categories of scholarship Program

The Rev. Dr. Julius Sarwolo Nelson Scholarship and Financial Aid Program is divided into two (2) categories:

- A). Scholarship is for an active young person who is dedicated and committed to the work of the church, through their local, district, and Conference United Methodist Youth or Young Adult Fellowship of the Liberia Area of United Methodist Church able to obtain or has obtained B or 3.00-grade point average during application but does not have the means to stay or to obtain a college education. This category of the scholarship will cover the beneficiary's registration/tuition, book fees, and access to CUMYAF research center for four years of studies at the University of Liberia and Community Colleges provided:
- (I)That the Beneficiary maintains the grade points average [GPA] of 3.00;
- (II) That the beneficiary remains an active and committed member of the United Methodist Church;
- (III) That there is a continuous flow of resources sufficient to cover beneficiaries.





- B). Financial Aid is for an active young person who is dedicated and committed to the work of the church, through their local, district, and Conference United Methodist Youth or Young Adult Fellowship and does not have the means of college education, and additionally is unable to obtain or has not obtained a 3.00-grade point average during the time of application. Therefore, the Financial Aid beneficiary is entitled to registration or tuition only provided:
- (A) That the Beneficiary passes eighty percent (80%) of their registered courses as provided by their institution when admitted.
- (B) That the beneficiary remains an active and committed member of the United Methodist Church.
- (C) That there is a continuous flow of resources sufficient to cover beneficiaries.

3.0 Purpose of the Scholarship

The purpose of the Rev. Dr. Julius Sarwolo Nelson, Jr. Scholarship is to fulfill the Holy Scripture by answering to the Great Commission (Matthew 28: 18-20) in accordance with the mission of the church.

The young people are an integral part of the United Methodist Church in Liberia and have noticed that the lay people, most especially are not benefiting from the Global and Annual Church scholarships, only because they are restricted to certain disciplines and institutions. In support of the ministry of the church in Liberia, the young people have embarked on a scholarship program in enhancing and building the capacity of its members for the better improvement of the church and society.

4.0 Eligible Institutions

The Rev. Dr. Julius Sarwolo Nelson, Jr. Scholarship and Financial Aid program is limited to the University of Liberia and Community Colleges.

5.0 Donors

Donors of the Rev. Dr. Julius Sarwolo Nelson, Jr. scholarship and Financial Aid program are funded by the:

- I. Rev. Dr. Julius Sarwolo Nelson, Jr. foundation and family
- II. Philanthropist United Methodist Member
- III. United Methodist institution /organization
- IV. Philanthropist individuals/ organizations through the young people of the United Methodist church

6.0 Methodology and Selection Procedure

Any young person who wants to take advantage of this scholarship and financial aid opportunities shall:

- I. Express their intent firstly by writing a letter of intent to the joint scholarship committee of the Conference Youth and Young Adult Fellowships.
- II. Submit along with the letter of intent all documents (recent grade sheet, two (2) recommendation letters [1 from Local/district president, 1 from local pastor/district coordinator or superintendent];
- III. Sit for an interview with the joint scholarship committee.
- IV. Qualified person names will be processed and submitted to the various institutions to which they have applied or received admission thereof.

7.0 Administration and Responsibilities

The administrative aspect of the Rev. Dr. Julius Sarwolo Nelson, Jr. Scholarship and Financial Aid program shall include but not be limited to:



- I. The leadership and the joint committee on scholarship is the sole authority of this educational opportunity.
- II. They are the only people who will do the vetting and qualifying beneficiaries.
- III. All fees of beneficiaries will be paid into the destinated school's accounts only by the designated individual of the fellowships.
- IV. All fees and slots will be given to the fellowship, not an individual student.

Now, therefore, it worth noting that this scholarship has not commenced but we strongly hoped that it will take effect as of this Conference Year 2022/23 such that we were able to be obtained US\$304.00 United States Dollars and LD\$28,370.00 as the available cash since the launch of the Scholarship Foundation nearly 5 years ago.

Bishop's Scholarship

We are super excited and sincerely pleased to inform us all that, our team was able to have obtained 21 scholarship slots from Bishop's office for Young Adults who want to pursue the post high school studies at the United Methodist University only. As part of the decentralization and accountability processes, the scholarship committee through the secretarial effected a conference-wide memorandum calling for interested young adults to apply.

Those scholarships are funded by Bishop Samuel J. Quire, Jr. as the fulfilment of his pledge of 15 scholarships for young adults during our 36th Annual Assembly. In a consultative meeting wherein, the leadership stressed the importance of ensuring that opportunities be given to every district and circuit, our Bishop increased the 15 slots to 22 slots. Thus, all eligible young adults were encouraged to apply, keeping in mind of specified eligibility criteria as follows:

- Be an active young adult at your local, but very familiar with your district/conference activities
- Complete and submit the application & recommendation forms
- Be recommended by your leadership.
- ❖ Be accessible for the interview (it will take place by phone, or online if you are NOT IN MONTSERRADO). Therefore, make sure that your phone number included in the application is on and working).
- ❖ <u>Note:</u> The Scholarship Committee also accepted applications from young adults who are not located in their church or district but are active at the Conference Young Adult Fellowship.

Applicant's Responsibilities were to:

- ✓ Ensure that you take and pass the United Methodist University entrance exam
- ✓ The scholarship has no credit limit, but the successful applicant will need to pay for entrance, admission, and registration fees only.
- ✓ It is your responsibility to ensure that your high school documents are correct
- ✓ If you are already in college, or you have dropped out, send your recent grade sheet along with your application package.
- ✓ Make sure your phone number(s) or contacts are always active and reachable.
- ✓ Successful applicants/beneficiaries are required to be active members of CUMYAF Campus Ministries, carrying out evangelism, Bible studies, fellowship, and participate in CUMYAF's activities regularly to maintain scholarship. The Conference President will constitute and commission the CUMYAF Campus Ministries when he receives successfully applicants' list from the Scholarship Committee.





Regrettably, despite all the efforts, only 15 applicants timely applied as specified with all their required documents. Those fifteen (15) candidates namely Bro. James Barmonh, Sis. Lydia Flomo, Bro. Obadiah Smythe, Bro. Lewis Worlogar, Sis. Geta Nyagweh, Sis. Mariama Wollor, Sis. Nora Gbor, Bro. Kortee Smith, Sis. Victoria Dorleleay, Bro. Emmanuel Dolo, Bro. Emmanuel Kahn, Bro. Isaac Cammue, Sis. Priscilla Fedrick, Sis. Vivian E. Ballah, and Bro. Victor Robertson were all selected and are now in school.

Additionally, two other young adults namely, Bro. Isaac Cammue and Jestina Jimmy from Jorquelleh District lately submitted some of their required documents. We did our best for bishop's office to include their names on the listing since in fact all of our slots were not filled but all efforts proved futile.

Howbeit, to ensure that they enter and stay in school, I, your humble servant, Emmanuel Kpon Saye pledged at my own expense to pay for four courses for both so that they can be in school this semester. Afterward, by next semester, they can be included on the scholarship automatically without any application. When this successful, it means that by next semester, we will still need additional four persons to get our slots completely filled.

Thus, I strongly encourage any young desiring to benefit, to take the upcoming United Methodist University entrance and organize all college admission documents so that you can get this opportunity. You can apply now if you've met all requirements stated above on by completing the application forms annexed to this report.

Spiritual Growth

We led a week-long bible study activities during the Easter celebration devotion with different young adults speakers from within the young adult fellowship. It was the first time ever in our history to conduct online devotion that young adults residents in Liberia and beyond have the opportunity to read, listen and participate in sharing of God's words emanating from within the fellowship not in the local church. Additionally, at all of our activities, we have conducted Bible studies, praise and worpship and preached the Good News to our fellow young adults, youth and adult participants withing and beyond the local church. Verlyn Labala Gono and her team are appreciated for leading.

Finance

During this Conference year, the Fellowship adopted the total cost of programs and activities amounting to US\$141,850 and an annual come with approximate of 96% accounting for expenditure but the realization was far from reality because of the current economic situation the country. My financial team members led by Allington Ballah are appreciated for their services over the year.

Conclusion

It's incumbent on us as Christ followers to do exactly as the founder of our church, John Wesley has said that do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can. As long you do this, Heaven is yours.

We attribute of our achievement is attributed to God Almighty and secondly to all of my officers.



REF. Honorable Attention and Immediate Action

We are writing to bring to your attention the horrible, heartbreaking, and unacceptable death of one of our Christian Brothers, N. Abraham T. Mulbah, male, age 26 whose lifeless body was found a few miles outside Gbarnga, Bong County, Republic of Liberia on February 28, 2022. He was Jorquelleh District Young Adult Fellowship Secretary General as well as a motorcyclist last seen with his motorbike but since his corpse was discovered, his motorbike has not been located as of today.

In view of the supra mentioned, we request your honorable office to launch a full-scale investigative search to arrest, charge, indict and investigate anyone who will be linked to such purposeful, knowing, negligent, and willful act with substantial disregard to the value of his life which ultimately resulted to the intentional termination of the existence of a promising young adult, Christ Servant, and Church leader, N. Abraham T. Mulbah.

The above-mentioned fellowship is a Christian Organization, specifically, a subsegment of the United Methodist Church comprising Young People from 20 Districts and 2 Circuits across Liberia's Episcopal Area. The Conference United Methodist Young Adult Fellowship (United Methodist Young People ages 25 -35 years) provides oversight on Young people's activities and wellbeing.

Constitution Revision/Amendment Propositions (Highlighted)

- 3.2. The Membership of the CUMYAF shall not be limited by sex or race, but however, to become a member one MUST be within the ages of Twenty-five (25) years and thirty-five (35) years, professed Christianity, and a baptized and confirmed United Methodist.
- 3.3 Subject to changes in the Book of Discipline, all United Methodists between the ages of 25 years to thirty-five (35) years, regardless of status, marital or otherwise, are considered Young Adults and should work with his or their local Young Adult Fellowship and District until the attainment of age thirty-six (36).
- 3.4 Affiliated Membership of the Conference United Methodist Young Adult Fellowship shall be extended to organizations such as the National Student Christian Council (NSCC), Sierra Leone United Methodist Young Adult Ministry, West Africa Central Conference Young Adult Fellowship (WACCYAF), Liberia Council of Churches Youth Desk (LCCYD) and other Organizations, provided however that said Organization or Institution profess and maintain Christian Values. They shall be called upon from time to time to participate in programs or projects as may be deemed necessary and shall be informed of the Fellowship's operation.
- 4.1. B. Young Adults coming in conflict with the District Superintendent, District Conference Executives, and Local Church Leadership shall complain through an official written communication to the immediate supervising District or Conference Leadership. Complaints involving the President or Executives of the Conference shall be made to the council of the Young People Ministry. All complaints must be accompanied by pieces of evidence where applicable
- 4.1.C. Upon receipt of a complaint, an ad-hoc committee on investigation comprising Five current and former young people leaders shall be appointed to investigate the complaint and submit findings thereof to the Executive Council or Council on Young People Ministry for decision.
- 4.2. That CUMYAF shall chapter all local Young Adult Fellowship; the Chapter and the Membership Cards shall be sold for a price to be determined by the Executive Council. Only Chartered United Methodist Young Adult Fellowships shall enjoy all rights and privileges of a United Methodist Young Adult group. 5.2.1. President

The president shall preside over all meetings of the fellowship; shall with the advice and consent of the Executive Committee, appoint delegations, representatives, advisors, and committees; shall head the delegation of the fellowship to the Liberia Annual Conference/ UMC sessions; shall represent the fellowship on all board, committee, councils, and commissions of the LAC/UMC as provided for by the UMC Book of Discipline; shall serve as ex-officio on all committees of the fellowship; shall represent the fellowship on all boards of affiliate member organizations, and shall be the only 'A' signatory to the fellowship's account.

5.2.3. Second Vice President



The Second Vice President shall in consultation with the Executive Committee coordinate the affairs and implement the activities of the fellowship in the leeward districts and circuit of the Conference that are of reasonable proximity to his district of origin or residence; were applicable to a District, the Second Vice President shall hail from and coordinate the affairs of Local Churches outside the Headquarters and or City limit of the District Conference. He/she and the president/ First Vice shall not hail or be residents of the same district or local unit.

Districts may choose to have only one Vice president, but local units shall only have one. Where there is only one vice president, he/she shall function as would the First Vice enshrined hereinabove.

5.2.4. General Secretary

The General Secretary shall keep all records/ documents of the fellowship; shall take and provide the minutes of every meeting of the fellowship; shall prepare the agenda for meetings in consultation with the president; shall cite members to meetings; send out invitations and coordinate the secretariat of the fellowship. He/She shall perform other functions delegated by the president or the Executive Council and must be cognizant of the work of all committees of the Fellowship.

5.3.0. Qualifications of Elected Executives

5.3.1 The President shall be at least a high school graduate; must have been an active member of the fellowship for at least two (2) consecutive years at all levels of the Fellowship. The First and Second Vice Presidents shall have similar qualifications.

XI. Committee on Grievance and Ethics

5.5.12. Committee on Grievances and Ethics (COGE)

- a. There shall be a Committee on Grievance and Ethics which shall have jurisdiction to hear and decide all administrative and moral complaints brought against members and officers of the fellowship. The committee shall hear and decide on complaints brought before it within a reasonable time and submit a report to the immediate EXCO or assembly following the complaint. Upon receipt of a complaint, the committee may recommend to the executive committee temporary punitive actions such as suspension and recusal depending on the gravity of the complaint or in the interest of the fellowship provided that such temporary punitive action shall not exceed the immediate executive council meeting after the action had been taken.
- b. The committee shall be appointed by the president with the expressed consent of the executive committee and shall comprise five persons including two adult former leaders and three current young adults with impeccable characters and professional discipline provided that there must be a legal professional, a pastor or deacon and at least two female members.
- c. Members appointed to the committee shall serve a term of two years and shall only be removed for a cause proven and in which case, a replacement shall be appointed to complete the unexpired term.
- d. The committee shall employ an alternative dispute resolution mechanism or investigation method in reaching a decision over complaints brought before its





decisions made by the committee shall be based on a simple majority vote provided that all votes must be expressed.

e. The committee shall submit its findings and recommendation upon investigation or resolution to the immediate scheduled executive council meeting or called executive council meeting following the complaint for action. The EXCO upon receipt of the committee's findings and recommendations or resolution shall vote by secret ballot or headcount to confirm, modify or reject the recommendations of the committee.

ARTICLE SIX: ELECTIONS

D) Voting rights and candidacy for Executive Committee of the Conference shall be limited to Elected Executives, Chairpersons, Co-Chairpersons and Secretary of Standing Committees, Special Presidential Appointees, and delegates, provided that the special presidential appointees shall be defined by the administrative policy of each fellowship.




Programs and Activities

Planning Retreat:

This activity was observed from the twenty-second (22^{nd}) of September 2022 to the twenty-fifth (25^{th}) of September 2022. The host for said activity was the Owensgrove region of the Kakata Farmington River District Conference.

The 31st Annual Assembly of the KFRD/YAF

The 31st Annual Assembly of the Kakata Farmington River District Conference Young Adults' Fellowship was successfully and graciously observed from the Tenth (10th) of November 2022 to the thirteenth (13th) of November 2022. It was held with the First United Methodist Church Marshall, Marshall City Margibi County, under the Theme: "Take on responsibilities in the days of youth" with text taken from Lamentation 3:27 and Ref. Ecclesiastes 12:1. During said activity, we gracefully received the presence of two of CUMYAF officials, in the person of the First Vice President Sis. Martha Dobboh and the Royal Highness.

Meetings/Visitation and Membership:

The young adult fellowship's regular meetings are slated for the last Saturday of every month which is rotational and is used as a means of visitation to other churches.

The leadership has been able to visit a total amount of nineteen (19) churches out of the total amount of thirty-eight (38) churches in the district during the period under review. Been faced with the challenge of gathering an accurate amount of members, is due to some of which we were able to present to Bishop Samuel J. Quire Jr. at the CUMYAF Annual Assembly held with the Weala District which stated, "if Bishop Quire does not intervene into the issue of forceful graduation of the Young Adults Fellowship's members by local Church Pastors on the Kakata Farmington River District, there will be no young people's ministry in the next few years". This has not been addressed since and is a serious impediment to our full data collection. It's also a serious problem that we can't have most of our churches attending our activities to give us an account of their membership.

Therefore, we are just trying our best to educate the people about their rights and require age for the next level of our Church. With this, we have just started a membership form process in order that we can gather all important information on our members.

Finance:

This Administration began her services with a very challenging financial standing. This is due to the same fact that our local churches are not attending activities and are not making their contribution towards the running of the Fellowship. Therefore, the past leadership presented a record of LD\$ 8,000.00 plus USD\$62.00 that was left in the account of the District.

Since our ascendency, of all the programs that were held, we have raised the total amount of L\$55,060.00 plus US\$230.00. Of this amount, US\$200.00 plus L\$50,000.00 was expended which leaves us with the amount of L\$5,000.00 plus US\$23.00. This amount, with good and perfect consultation, has been deposited on a mobile money sim card as the fellowship's savings.

Ecumenical Relations:

Physical facts show our peaceful and perfect Ecumenical Relations with our partners and friends. The cordiality with our Young Adults Fellowship's members, local pastors, district organizations, coordinators, and district superintendent has been improved over the period. We have built a concrete relationship with our District Conference, District Youth, District Men, District Women, District Ushers board, District Board of Laity, the Conference United Methodist Young Adults, and other District Young Adult Fellowships. As vivid proof, we (the KFRDYAF) were represented at the celebration of the MDYAF great weekend that



was celebrated in Sierra Leone, Freetown. This was based on the cordiality between both districts. To also state that our ecumenical relations have extended out of the bounds of our church, the Jubilee Praise and Worship Center has always been a part of our programs and activities.

Achievements and Challenges:

This leadership has been able, through appeals and negotiations to have three of her active members placed on the scholarship. Two of the three were given to us by the Conference United Methodist Young Adults' fellowship and the last one was given to us by our Distinct Personality of the year 2022/2023, Fth. Malcolm W. Scott. The three beneficiaries are; Sis. Mercy Harding, Sis. Vivian Evon Ballah and Bro. Obediah Smythe.

Let me report to this Assembly with no discomfort, that our district's serious challenge is finance. This has been and remains a contributing factor to the challenges we faced as a fellowship. Due to this, most of our members and churches continuously stay away from our activities, and knowing the fact that most of the churches in our district are rural churches that are financially weak, we usually just keep encouraging them.

Commendation:

The first acknowledgment goes to God almighty for his grace, mercy, sustenance, direction, guidance, and wisdom to lead the young adults' fellowship of the KFRD. Program and Activities



Commendation



Progress





Grand Bassa Young Adult Fellowship's Report


Protocol:

WORKING RELATIONSHIP



Achievements/Graduation:



CHALLENGES


Ecumenical Relationship


I bring you greetings on behalf of the leadership of Gompa District YAF as I seek your indulgent to bring this annual message of the church year which includes:

Finance






For the period under review, the fellowship was blessed to have all it elected and Appointed officers working together to get the district to where it is today.

The leadership of the fellowship has been supported by the Appointed officers, Local Presidents, and the host of other United Methodist Young Adults from the St. Paul River District.



The MDYAF Annual Carnival and Great Weekend



Cabinet Retreats (MDYAF & CUMYAF)




ADMINISTRATION


FINANCES


RECOMMENDATION:




Their memories will be forever be remembered because of their numerous services and contributions during their time on this planet and with the Fellowship.
